“United for His glory, we exist to connect in mission, share resources, and celebrate what God is doing among us, in collaboration with the body of Christ, and we give the glory to God for all that He is doing through the Hispanic Baptist Network,” said Dr. Bruno Molina, Executive Director of the Hispanic Baptist Network (HBN).

Molina, who is already settled in the official HBN office located at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas, said, “Last year we were able to connect in person in 17 states, and we already have training and fellowship events scheduled across the country through 2026. We will continue to advocate for immigration reform, and thank God, we now have offices.”

According to Molina, the HBN has already scheduled church revitalization efforts in California, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, South Carolina, New York, and New Jersey.

“United for His glory, we remain excited to collaborate with local churches, SBC entities, state conventions and associations, and I encourage you to join us in serving the Hispanic community by praying for the HBN, participating in our events, and financially supporting the HBN. God is doing something new; join us (Isaiah 43:18-19),” Molina shared.

The Cooperative Program is the method used by the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) to finance ministries that fulfill the Great Commission. For example, funds raised through the Cooperative Program are used to send missionaries to all parts of the world and to support the six Southern Baptist seminaries, which provide theological education to thousands of students worldwide. The official historical celebration of the Cooperative Program's centennial took place at the Renaissance Convention Center in Memphis, Tennessee, on May 13, 2025.

Dr. Bruno Molina, Executive Director of the Hispanic Baptist Network, signed the Declaration of Cooperation as a token of gratitude to God and solidarity in future cooperation for the Great Commission among Southern Baptists, and he also served as the Hispanic representative during the time of prayer. He prayed for the state conventions and their mission. "It was a great honor to be part of this momentous celebration," said Molina.

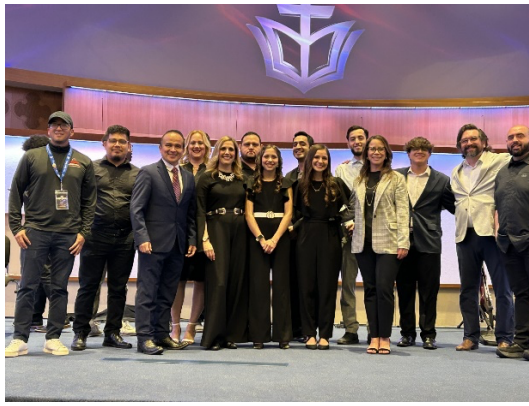

## The 2025 Hispanic Celebration in Dallas

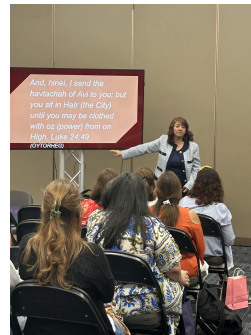

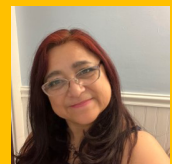
